2023 ANNUAL **MEETING:**

ELECTIONS, ACCOMPLISHMENTS, **LOOKING AHEAD**

Field Regina Northrop Neighborhood Group held its 2023 Annual Meeting and Election at McRae Park on May 13.

Nate Lansing, FRNNG Board President, opened the meeting with an overview of accomplishments since the election of an interim board last September. Topping the list were:

- Strengthening the board's partnership with McRae Park
- Hosting events such as Earth Day and the Duck Race
- Making essential revisions to align programs and activities with our current finances
- Announcing the hiring of a new Community Coordinator
- · Conducting a neighborhood survey
- Making changes to the organization's bylaws

Changes to the bylaws were put together under the supervision of a legal group selected by Minneapolis' Neighborhood and Community Relations department. The biggest change is that starting in 2024, officer roles (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer) will be appointed by the board from its members the month after elections are held. Field, Regina and North and South Northrop representatives will still be elected by community members.

PERFECT DAY FOR A DUCK (RACE)!

The weather for the 3rd Annual Minnehaha Creek Duck Race on May 6, sponsored by Field Regina Northop Neighborhood Group, was perfect—cloudy, drizzly and chilly. And the 2,000 ducks and hundreds of spectators loved it!

There were food trucks, face painting, educational exhibits, music, special guest speakers and lots of excitement as the ducks "paddled" their way to the finish line. Volunteers braved the creek's icy waters to make sure that no ducks were left behind. Prizes were awarded for the speediest ducks to wrap up a great community get together.

The ducks are taking a well-deserved break, but their training will start next April for the 2024 race. Don't miss it!

PROJECT AIMS TO BANISH BUCKTHORN ALONG THE CREEK

Join Field Regina Northrop neighbors this summer to remove invasive buckthorn along Minnehaha Creek and preserve our shared green spaces.

In early 2023 FRNNG began a Park Stewardship Agreement with the Minneapolis Parks and Recreation Board (MPRB) to address rapid erosion and ecological damage along the watershed.

The wooded area between 12th Ave. and Bloomington Ave. along the creek is struggling from an overgrowth of buckthorn that crowds out native plants and trees and is detrimental to wildlife.

Two buckthorn-removal dates remain: August 12 and 27 from 9 to 11 a.m. Training and hand tools are provided for the removal. We use the high-cut method, so no power tools or chemicals are involved. Volunteers meet at the 14th Ave. S bridge over the creek.
